Hang a string from a nail...
so the string splits the x-ring in half.
Fire a field point arrow from a distance of 9 feet.

Step 1: If the field point misses left
move all of your pins to the left.
This field point arrow is shot at 3 yards.

Step 2: If the field point misses right
move all of your pins to the right.
This field point arrow is shot at 3 yards.

Step 3: Soon, when the pins are in the right spot...
the field point will hit the string.
This field point arrow is shot at 3 yards.

Step 4: Fire 3 arrow group at 10 yards.
If the middle of the 3 arrow group misses left...
move ARROW REST to the RIGHT.

Step 5: Fire 3 arrow group at 10 yards.
If the middle of the 3 arrow group misses right...
move ARROW REST to the LEFT.

Step 6: Soon, 3 arrow group
is split in half by the string.

Step 7: NOW. Go Back to 3 yards.
Double check with single
field point arrow.

Adjust d-loop up or down...
and it may tighten the group.

You might need to make a small
adjustment to pins (left or right).
